ROGER HALL is a member of the Department of History, University of Western Ontario. Various Canadian journals and magazines have carried his reviews and articles.

KENT M. HAWORTH is an archivist in the Government Records and Manuscript Division, Provincial Archives of British Columbia.

R. SCOTT JAMES became City Archivist of Toronto in 1975, and is co-founder of the Toronto Area Archivists Group.

JAMES KNIGHT is Director of Programmes, Heritage Canada. He was formerly an historical researcher with the Canadian Inventory of Historic Building, Parks Canada, and later Head, Cataloguing Unit in the National Map Collection, Public Archives of Canada, where he was also responsible for architectural plans.
