

## Notes on Contributors

- IRVING ABELLA is Associate Professor of History and Director of Canadian Studies at Glendon College, York University. He is founding chairman of the Committee on Canadian Labour History (Canadian Historical Association) and is the author of *Nationalism, Communism and Canadian Labour*. He is also the editor of *On Strike* and the co-editor of *The Canadian Worker in the Twentieth Century* which will be published in the fall by Oxford University Press.
- GEORGE BRANDAK is Curator of Manuscripts at the Special Collections Division, University of British Columbia Library. He served as archivist with the Provincial Archives of Alberta from 1966 to 1969, and with the University of Saskatchewan Archives from 1971 to 1973.
- ERNEST J. DICK is an archivist with the Sound Archives of the Public Archives of Canada.
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- DAVID B. GRACY II, Director of the Texas State Archives, established and directed the Southern Labor Archives, Georgia State University, for almost six years. The founding editor of *Georgia Archive*, he serves on the editorial board of the *American Archivist*, and is a member of the Council of the Society of American Archivists.
- JACQUES GRIMARD is an archivist at the Centre de recherche en civilisation canadienne-française, University of Ottawa.
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- AILSA C. HOLLAND trained as an archivist in University College Dublin, at the Archives nationales in Paris and at the Bundesarchiv in Koblenz. She is a member of the Archives Department, UCD, lecturing in archive administration and records management. In 1976 she was made Secretary of the Irish Society for Archives.
- GREGORY S. KEALEY teaches Canadian social and working class history at Dalhousie University. Author of several books and articles, he is the Treasurer of the Committee on Canadian Labour History (Canadian Historical Association) and is co-editor of *Labour/Le Travailleur*.
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- PHILIP P. MASON is Director of the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs, and Professor of History at Wayne State University. He was formerly State Archivist of Michigan and served as Executive Secretary of the Society of American Archivists from 1963-1967, and President from 1970-1971.
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- EDWIN WELCH is Ottawa City Archivist. Before coming to Canada he was City Archivist of Plymouth, Southampton, and first Archivist of Churchill College.
